MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ANNE ARUNDEL COMMUNITY COLLEGE & TOWSON UNIVERSITY August 1, 2018

Allied Health B.T.P.S. Degree

Anne Arundel Community College, Arnold, Maryland, and Towson University, agree to follow the articulation of courses outlined in the articulation (course equivalency) document, for completion of requirements for the Bachelor of Technical or Professional Studies degree in Allied Health (Attachment A), which is attached to, and incorporated by reference into, this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). The following principles guide the operation of this MOU, with the requirements for transfer in specific curricula set forth in Attachment A.

- 1. Towson University will accept a maximum number of 64 credits from Anne Arundel Community College as outlined in the Attachment A. The number of transferable credits specific to this program is reflected in Attachment A.
- 2. Students who have completed the Associate of Applied Science Degree in the Massage Therapy program at Anne Arundel Community College may transfer into Towson University's Allied Health program with junior standing provided that the student has completed all courses identified on Attachment A (which is attached to, and incorporated by reference into, this MOU) with a cumulative GPA of 2.00 or higher. Courses completed at Anne Arundel Community College with 300 or 400 level Towson University course equivalencies will transfer as lower-level credit but will satisfy course content as indicated.
- 3. Only courses in which a grade of C (2.00) or better is earned will apply toward the major at Towson University.
- 4. In accordance with the MHEC transfer policy pertaining to general education requirements, Towson University will accept the completion of Anne Arundel Community College's general education requirements (GenEds) and students will be required to complete courses at Towson University to satisfy the remaining *University Core* requirements as shown in Attachment A.
- 5. Towson University recognizes college-level experiential learning gained through previous work, military and/or volunteer service or life experience. Credit for prior learning may also be established through course challenge or standardized credit by examination.
- 6. Anne Arundel Community College students transferring to Towson University will be given every consideration for financial aid and will be eligible to compete for academic scholarships upon entrance to Towson University subject to stated scholarship deadlines.
- 7. Both Anne Arundel Community College and Towson University agree to work together to facilitate the transfer of students from Anne Arundel Community College to Towson University to work cooperatively to insure the high quality of the programs at the respective institutions. Transfer of students will be in accordance with policies and procedures of both institutions, as they may be amended from time to time.

- 8. This MOU will be in effect initially for ten years, beginning *Fall 2018*, with a review every two years by both parties. Any revisions the parties deem necessary must be evidenced in writing and signed by the authorized officials of each institution. The MOU may be terminated by either party for due cause and after adequate notice of not less than six months is given to the other party.
- 9. Towson University will establish procedures to provide information on the academic progress of Anne Arundel Community College students enrolled as part of this MOU.
- 10. This MOU, when signed, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings between the parties respecting the matter hereof.

AACC Course Selection

GENERAL EDUCATION:

- 1) Students should choose CTA 100 Computing and Information Technology or CTP 103 Theories & Applications of Digital Technology as their General Education Computer Technology course in order to also satisfy AACC's computer competency requirement. Students who choose another course for the General Education Computer Technology requirement may be required to complete additional coursework at AACC in order to satisfy the computer competency graduation requirement.
- 2) Students who choose to complete the BIO 231 & 232 or BIO 233 & 234 sequence in lieu of BIO 230 will satisfy both Cores 7 and 8. Students who only complete BIO 230 will be required to complete the Core 8 requirement at TU.
- 3) Students must complete BIO 230, 231 & 232, or 233 & 234 with a C or higher in order to satisfy the program requirements at AACC.

MATHEMATICS: Students planning to pursue the Science and Professional Preparation Track in the Allied Health major at TU may consider MAT 137 College Algebra, MAT 145 Precalculus 1, MAT 146 Precalculus 2, or MAT 151 Accelerated Precalculus as their Mathematics Gen Ed course if they intend to complete PHYS elective options in the track. Students may also consider MAT 135 Statistics as their Mathematics Gen Ed course as a possible elective option in the track. NOTE: All major track electives must be approved by an Allied Health advisor.

GENERAL ELECTIVE:

- 1) Students who complete both BIO 230 and ENG 121 will need to complete an additional 3 credit course in order to meet the minimum of 60 credits required for graduation. If students must complete an additional elective to earn 60 credits, they should consider one of the following recommendations:
 - a. Taking an approved general education course in order to satisfy the Core 12 Global Perspectives requirement. Any approved Arts & Humanities or Social & Behavioral Science general education course, such as foreign languages and courses with an emphasis on non-Western culture are recommended.
 - b. Taking an elective course to apply to either a requirement or course prerequisites within their intended Allied Health track. NOTE: Students may refer to the TU catalog for track electives and prerequisites, and they should contact TU's Allied Health program coordinator if they need assistance with choosing a track or planning coursework toward their track.

NOTE: Students choose one of six tracks: Administration and Management, Advanced Respiratory Therapy, Education, Family Studies, Health Promotion, Wellness, Prevention & Community Health Education, or Science and Professional Preparation. A list of possible course electives for each track is available in the TU catalog. Other course selections are possible, subject to the approval of the program director. All students will complete an ethics course and a capstone course; the required ethics course varies by track. Each student's program of study and the courses they choose must be approved by an Allied Health advisor.
