



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN MONTGOMERY COLLEGE, UNIVERSITIES AT SHADY GROVE AND TOWSON UNIVERSITY

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION AT THE UNIVERSITIES AT SHADY GROVE

This Agreement is initiated this day, September 24, 2013, between Montgomery College, hereafter referred to as "MC", Towson University, a constituent institution of the University System of Maryland, and agency of the State of Maryland, hereafter referred to as "TU," and the Universities at Shady Grove, hereafter referred to as "USG".

I. Purpose

This Articulation Agreement is the result of discussions and meetings between the TU, MC and USG. The purpose of this Articulation Agreement is to establish a collaboration between these three institutions in an effort to facilitate the transfer and degree completion of students earning the A.A.T. in Early Childhood Education at MC to the B.S. in Early Childhood Education from TU offered at USG. The Agreement reflects an academically sound collaborative program which will lead to an efficient use of each institution's resources.

II. Goals

To offer the students at MC the opportunity to pursue the third and fourth years of the Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Education from TU at the Universities at Shady Grove. The parties to this collaboration will offer the appropriate combination of courses: MC to offer lower level courses at MC as set forth on **Attachment A** hereto incorporated by reference herein and TU to offer upper level courses and EDUC 203 Teaching and Learning in a Diverse Society offered at USG, to ensure that a student can complete the requirements of the degree from TU within a specified period of time. If at any time MC develops and offers a course that TU deems equivalent to EDUC 203 Teaching and Learning in a Diverse Society on the MC campus, then TU agrees to discontinue its offering of the lower level course at USG and to direct students to the MC campus for such a course.

III. Location/Facilities

This program will be based at the Universities at Shady Grove campus and will be coordinated by appropriate personnel at TU. USG is providing TU with appropriate on-campus classroom, lab space and office space.

IV. Ongoing Collaboration/Modification/Term and Termination In the spirit of articulation, faculty representatives from both MC and TU agree to meet regularly, but no less than biennially, to re-examine this Agreement and discuss ways to enhance and strengthen this collaboration. MC and TU agree to communicate program changes to each other in a timely manner to avoid disruption to student progress toward degree completion. Modification of this Agreement must be made between the institutions in writing and signed by all parties. The initial term of this Agreement shall be two years, with three (3) automatic renewals of two years each, subject to termination notice requirements. Any party may terminate this Agreement upon 6 months written notice to the President of either institution. In the event of termination, each party agrees, to the extent reasonably and financially practicable, to continue the collaboration until each student admitted based on the A.A.T. degree in early childhood education from MC: (a) the opportunity to complete the degree with substituted courses of a similar course content, or (c) chosen to complete an equivalent degree at another institution.
