#### **CBE Prerequisite Checking Guide - Fall 2024**

#### Use this guide to ensure you meet the requirements for upper-level and "Majors Only" CBE courses BEFORE registering.

If you will not have at least 60 units at the end of this semester, read No. 3 Verify Class Rank BEFORE attempting to enroll in courses requiring JUNIOR class rank.

#### Prepare Now for Registration!

#### 1. Verify Your Course Prerequisites

Check your "Academic Requirements" report to make sure you have completed the prerequisite(s) for the course(s) in which you intend to enroll. Each prerequisite must match exactly or you won't be able to register for the class.

If you transferred in a prerequisite: Your transcript should show the TU equivalent as the prerequisite. If your transcript does not show a TU equivalency for a transferred prerequisite course, you need to submit a "Petition for Acceptance of Transfer Credits for CBE Major/Minor" form to CBE Student Academic & Career Services.

If you are currently enrolled in a prerequisite: You are allowed to register on the condition that you complete the prerequisite with a "C" or higher grade. If you do not pass the prerequisite course, you must drop the class requiring this prerequisite or you will be **disenrolled**. Repeat the prerequisite course next term.

#### 2. Verify Your Major

Your current major is printed on your "Academic Requirements" report or your unofficial transcript. If the course prerequisite states ACCT, BUAD, EBUS, that means you need to be admitted into the screened major before you can register for the course, as it is considered "Majors Only". Admission to ACCT, BUAD & EBUS major will be processed after grades are posted in a term. Students may register for "majors only" courses after admission to the major has been processed by the Registrar's office (expected times are: Mid-January; late-January; early June; & approx. 3 weeks after summer sessions.)

#### 3. Verify Your Class Rank

Check your unofficial transcript for your total credits, to evaluate your class rank.

If you are a Sophomore who will have at least 45 units at the end of this term and you are either an admitted ACCT, BUAD or EBUS major, you maybe eligible for an EXCEPTION to register for "Junior" courses, if space is available. **AFTER your** scheduled Registration Appointment (date & time), go to the department listed on the chart below to receive the "Special Permission". Be prepared to provide the department with the course number and sections desired along with your Academic Requirements and current Degree Completion Plan (DCP).
