

Associate-to-Bachelor's (ATB) Degree Completion Option

ATB 2.0 – Summer Start



General Information for this Online/Hybrid Model

I. General Program Information

This dual enrollment option is available to eligible students after their first or second semester in the Hagerstown Community College (HCC) Registered Nursing Program. Admission is competitive and based on completed courses, grade point average (GPA), and professional conduct during the CCBC Nursing Program. Students will be enrolled as degree students at HCC and Towson University (TU) and begin to take TU courses after successful completion of one or more semesters of the Nursing Program at CCBC. Once the Associate of Science (A.S.) Degree is awarded at HCC, students will take the nursing licensure exam (NCLEX-RN) and continue coursework at TU to complete the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) Degree.

Ninety percent of the TU curriculum could be offered online or hybrid depending on student interest and enrollment. The practicum course in the final term (NURS 489) requires an in-person clinical component. Students may choose their preferred course format for the required upper-level electives at TU.

The program length is 9 terms, including winter and summer terms. It will take approximately 2.5 years to complete both degrees. HCC courses will be held at the Hagerstown Community College campus in Hagerstown, MD. Most TU courses will be held online or in a hybrid format at the University System of Maryland Hagerstown (USMH) Center in Hagerstown, MD.

Two degrees will be awarded: A.S. from HCC and B.S. from Towson University. A minimum of 30 credits must be completed at TU for the B.S. degree. Advisors will be available from both HCC and TU. Financial aid will be arranged through Towson University Office of Financial Aid.

II. Program Admission Requirements

- A. Completion of the first term or first two terms of the HCC Nursing Program
- B. GPA of 3.0 or higher and demonstrated professional conduct in Year 1 of HCC nursing courses
- A. Additional required courses (must be completed prior to final term at TU with a C or better):
 - General Chemistry with Lab (HCC CHM 101 or 103) – 4 credits
 - Nutrition for Health Professionals (HCC BIO 206) – 3 credits

Students must also complete a basic statistics course with a C (2.0) or higher before enrolling in TU's required nursing research course (NURS 435). Students are strongly encouraged to take HCC's MAT 116 Statistical Reasoning prior to starting their nursing program.

III. ATB Program Progression

Students must be successful in all required courses to continue in the ATB option. Students are expected to complete the sequence of study as outlined in the Towson University ATB curriculum plan. Students are required to meet regularly with their TU advisor to review their ATB curriculum plan. Students must successfully complete their associate degree prior to taking NURS 476 and NURS 484. Students must successfully pass the NCLEX-RN exam prior to taking NURS 489 (Practicum).

III. General Application Procedures

Students must apply to the TU ATB option by the program's deadline. Students who are admitted to the TU ATB option must be eligible to enroll at Towson University, but they do not have to apply to TU by the ATB deadline. The TU Department of Nursing will provide instructions to apply and enroll at the university if ATB admission is offered.

Applying to TU ATB

Students must apply and submit all required materials by the deadlines to be considered for ATB admission. Students are responsible for ensuring that their application materials are received. Applications may be reviewed after the deadline on a space-available basis.

Priority Application Deadline

- Summer Start – April 1

Required Materials

1. Department of Nursing Application for Admission: Associate to Bachelor’s Degree Completion Option (ATB) – Submit online at <https://www.towson.edu/chp/departments/nursing/undergrad/degree-options/associate-to-bs/admissions.html>
2. \$50 non-refundable application fee – Submit upon completion of online application form
3. Official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended – Submit to University Admissions (electronic transcripts preferred)
 - a. **Electronic transcripts:** Select “Towson University” in Parchment or other electronic transcript service
 - b. **Printed transcripts:** University Admissions, Towson University, 8000 York Road, Towson, Maryland 21252

Admission Decisions

The HCC and TU Nursing Departments will review completed applications for acceptance into the ATB option. Students will be notified of their admission decision either via email and/or letter. Any offer of admission given will be contingent upon successful completion of currently enrolled nursing courses at HCC. Students will be required to submit an updated transcript after the completion of the spring term to verify their nursing grades.

IV. Tuition, Fees, and Financial Aid

Students will be charged tuition and fees based on the policies of each institution. Tuition and fees are subject to change each academic year. Regional tuition rates may apply to out-of-state students living in the following counties: Adams, Franklin, and Fulton Counties, PA; Loudon County, VA; Berkley, Jefferson, and Morgan Counties, WV. If students are using financial aid, it will be processed through the TU Financial Aid Office based on the total enrollment at both institutions. ATB students may be enrolled part-time (6-11.5 credits) or full-time (12 or more credits) depending on the term. More information is available online:
