About this award

Arnold Blumberg (1925-2006) was an expert in mid-nineteenth century European diplomatic history. He taught at Towson from 1958 to 1998. In 1995 he was awarded the Towson University President's award for distinguished service to the University. The Arnold Blumberg Prize for Outstanding Achievement in European History is awarded to a Junior or Senior History Major based on proven excellence in European History courses and based on overall GPA.
