# Degree and Certificate Options to be Discussed

Option 1: A twelve course, Master of Science degree in Instructional Technology with a concentration in school library media.

Option 2: An eight-course, post master's degree certificate in library media for candidates who have previously earned a master's and possess teacher certification.

Note: the program is ALA/AASL/CAEP accredited and completion of either option results in MSDE library media specialist licensure.

### **Online Program of Study Options**

### **Main Campus Online Program**

Coursework is taken at your own pace with up to six or more courses completed each year. This option is available to master's degree and post-master's degree certificate candidates. Courses are billed at full tuition and fees. # **Towson Learning Network Multisystem Programs and County Cohorts**

Cohorts complete three courses per year (one fall, one spring, and one summer session course. Cohort courses are available to Maryland school employees and billed at discounted tuition (approximately 50%). The next master's degree and post master's degree certificate cohorts will begin in the fall 2025.
